Tourism Report

WELCOME CENTER

Weather delayed two installations at the Welcome Center this month.

- The Jefferson National Parks Association postponed installation of another rack for the Welcome Center from February 17 to February 24 due to the snow on President's Day.
- The photo display for the Missouri Bicentennial was twice-delayed by weather and ultimately the trailer upon which the exhibit was loaded ended up buried in a pile of snow and was unable to make the trip to Ste. Genevieve. That exhibit has been rescheduled for Thursday, July 15, through Tuesday, July 27.

GRANTS

We turned in our application last week for the Missouri Division of Tourism's Marketing Matching Grant 2.0, with \$21,741 in proposed allocations that require no local match. It was approved on Tuesday afternoon. The proposal includes:

- \$985 for a half-page in Missouri Life's Scenic Rides special publication.
- \$6,000 for 600,000 impressions of digital display ads managed by Missouri Life. (This component will go active in April through June and will include geofencing of certain locations and interests).
- \$6,791 for radio advertising through Entercom St. Louis stations KMOX and KEZK.
- \$8,000 for television advertising through WSIL for the Carbondale-Paducah-Cape market. (133 30-second commercials)

This will be in addition to more than \$9,000 in advertising that we will be doing through Instagram and Facebook this spring.

January 2021

Water Treatment Plant

- Well #4 failed during the early part of the month. Flynn was called in to replace the motor under warranty.
- Addition paint has been ordered to complete the painting inside the plant while weather allows.
- The control power transformer was ordered for High Service pump #3.
 There will be a delay due to shortage on equipment available. Still waiting
- Peristaltic pump for the lime feed system was rebuilt. The bearings were showing signs of failure. Staff switched to the back up pump during the rebuild.
- All location were checked for proper weatherization.

Wastewater Treatment

- The furnace at the wastewater plant was not working. Staff found a seized bearing on the fan motor and replaced it.
- Upon arrival the operator notices the return pumps were not working properly. The staff investigated and found that the float system was not functioning properly. We ended up replacing a low level float and returned the unit to normal operation.
- Met with the generator inspection company, concerning the onsite power generators. He will be doing a walk through and giving us a estimated cost of inspection and testing fees for each units for budgeting purposes.
- Routine maintenance and inspections were performed as scheduled.

Collection/Distribution

Collections

- Hwy 32 lift station had a busted line inside causing most of the fluid to recirculated. Staff found this during a routine inspection. Repairs were made immediately.
- Staff replaced the bio safe at the Progress Prky lift station that is being used to control the amount of grease being discharged in that area.
- Lift Station #1 electrical drive #2 failed and has had to be replaced. This is the main lift station for the city and was deemed and emergency.
- Staff was called to numerous location for sewer backups. Though they were not city issues, the staff clean the lines for precautionary measures.
- All lift stations were cleaned, inspected and winterized.
- Rags continue to be discharges to the sewer system from Progress Parkway area.
- All lift stations were inspected at a minimum of 3 times per week. Staff inspects for grease build up, vandalism, and any electrical issues that would indicate issues with pumps, motors, or controls.

Distribution

- Notified the Street Dept of the area where patching needs to be completed.
- Staff replaced brakes on the 1 ton chevy truck and complete service.
- Staff installed a hydrant extension on a hydrant on Builtmore St.
- Called to an address in Valle Springs for a leak. Not substantial and will be monitored.
- All remote buildings were cleaned, inspected and winterized,
- Estimates were submitted for the repairs needed to a driveway in St Jude due to a water main break.
- Staff checked heat tape on exposed fixtures to prevent freezing.

Customer Service

- Staff performed 20 line locates.
- Staff performed 51 work orders.
- Disconnects for non-payment 31.
- There were 4 loads of lime purchased.
